

MONDAY 11.10.25 - Matthew 6:9-15

The Lord's Prayer is probably the most familiar prayer taught by Jesus.

We are reminded of:

1. God's Holiness
2. God's rule to be established on Earth that will be complete when evil is destroyed and God establishes the new heaven and earth
3. Offering ourselves as doers of God's will, asking Him to guide, lead, and give us the means to accomplish His purposes on Earth
4. Relying on God for our daily needs
5. Forgiveness for ourselves and others
6. Protection from the evil one daily!

God wants our prayers to be simple and sincere. Our hearts need to be right **with** Him before we pray **to** Him. When we recite this prayer, we need to listen to each word... not just repeat the words we are so familiar with. It should be prayed in sincerity to a God who loves when we talk to Him!

SPACE FOR REFLECTION

TUESDAY 11.11.25 - Collossians 3:13

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you.

As Christians we are called to be slow to take offence and quick to forgive, but often it seems we are easily and quickly offended, and we carry those offenses around with us for a long time. Offenses left to smolder in our unconscious or conscious mind often turn into deep hurt and bitterness. That is why being quick to forgive is so important for us as Christians. True forgiveness means you promise not to bring the offence up again, either to the one who offended you or to yourself. In doing this you are striving to prevent disunity in the body of Christ and being purposeful to replace disunity with unity which is pleasing to God and presents a good testimony to an onlooking world. Is there someone in your life you need to forgive? Pray to God that He will give you the wisdom to know how to forgive and the courage to do it.

SPACE FOR REFLECTION

WEDNESDAY 11.12.25 - Ephesians 1:13-14

"Having believed, you were marked in him with a seal, the promised Holy Spirit, who is a deposit guaranteeing our inheritance."

By sealing us, the Holy Spirit has marked us as His own—permanently and irreversibly. The word "seal" means to make something secure, and the seal itself denotes ownership. This means that all those who have heard and believe—those who have placed their trust in Christ alone for eternal life—have been permanently sealed. This indicates the security of the believer. It's impossible to disregard, diminish, or destroy what God has done. Paul couldn't be clearer: All those who have believed the gospel of salvation have been sealed. The transaction is complete. The Holy Spirit Himself is the promise. Like a wedding ring is the symbol of a husband's fidelity to his wife, the Holy Spirit is God's uncompromising promise of eternal life to all who believe.

SPACE FOR REFLECTION

THURSDAY 11.13.25 - Isaiah 45:22

It seems these days that the number of issues affecting families is increasing. About the time that a most ridiculous issue divides parties, another even more sinister appears. Often no resolution seems possible because the positions taken are so adverse from each other. Holidays are absent some members, cards and presents and visits are lacking from loved ones, common courtesies of return mail or phone calls go unheeded, all because of positions on various modern issues.

Yet long ago it was discussed that if people focused their attentions on God, Christ the Savior, that people would grow towards one another and not apart.

Today's verse, and those preceding, offer a challenge. Go to any source for help and see what comes of it. "Turn to me...For I am God, and there is no other." Oh, may we all remember that in our times of trouble. Have faith and be secure in it.

SPACE FOR REFLECTION

FRIDAY 11.14.25 - Psalm 32:1-2

"Blessed [happy] is he whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the man whose sin the Lord does not count against him and in whose spirit is no deceit."

David begins this psalm with a happy shout of joy—a beatitude. David rejoices because his sin has been carried away, covered, and cancelled. God is the only One able to deal with our sin in such a way. Only the eternal, omnipotent God could remove sin and its consequences, and He can do it only because of Calvary. There Jesus died in full payment for our disobedience to God's laws. When we place our trust in Jesus for forgiveness, God gives us the gift of eternal life.

*My sin—oh, the bliss of this glorious thought!—
My sin, not in part but the whole,
Is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more,
Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul!*
