#### **MONDAY 3.14.22 – MATTHEW 22:41-45**

Do you know who Jesus is? I mean really know? Jesus loved to ask people about His identity just as He does here in Matthew 22. Peter's sermon in Acts 2 seeks to bring clarity once and for all. To all who hear, Peter tells them exactly who Jesus is... He is "both Lord and Messiah" (v.36).

Many of us (probably most of us and hopefully all of us) have put our trust in Jesus as Savior. But have we allowed Him, invited Him to become Lord of our lives.

It is trusting in Jesus as Savior, receiving His free gift of grace by faith that saves—this is called justification (forgiveness of sin and a right relationship with God) [see Ephesians 2:4-9]. But when we Jesus to be Lord of our lives, when we invite Him to have the first and final word, when we are completely surrendered to His will (in everything)—that's when something else can start to happen. We call that sanctification, being conformed more and more into the image/likeness of Christ, being set apart for His purposes and His glory.

How about you? Will you let Jesus be both Lord and Messiah, both Savior and King? Will you go all in and let Jesus have His way in everything you do, everything you say, everything you think, and everything you are?


# **TUESDAY 3.15.22 - 1 CORINTHIANS 15:12-19**

Have you ever thought about the Bible being the Word of God? We often say, "the Word of God" in an almost flippant manner, but what are we saying when we say, "the Word of God"? We are talking about words of the one who: out of nothing, spoke the universe into existence, whose wisdom is so great it cannot be measured, whose knowledge of you and what you need is beyond comprehension, the one who is perfect in every way. The Bible is God's very words to us. Man may attack it, dispute it, hate it, or dismiss it, but that does not change it. It is irrefutable, completely trustworthy, powerful,

life changing, and the final authority in all matters. It is the rule book for life.

As we consider these truths, we need to consider this question. By whose rules are you playing?

### WEDNESDAY 3.16.22 - ACTS 2:42-47

"They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer" (Acts 2:42).

A car traveling on Interstate 80 needs to have proper and balanced inflation in all four tires to travel safely. No one would venture to drive any distance with the left front tire inflated at 32 psi, the right front at 28 psi, the left rear at 36 psi, and the right rear at 10 psi. That would be dangerous and unthinkable.

Christians traveling down life's road need to be involved in four activities to experience spiritual safety—the Word of God, Fellowship of Believers, Lord's Table, and Prayer. If we're going to live into our God-given purpose as a church, we need to do it together. Truly, "How good... it is when God's people live together in unity" (Psalm 133:1).
