TUESDAY 3.1.22 – 1 THESSALONIANS 1:8-10

We as followers of Christ are awaiting Jesus's return, just like they were. Do you think people like Paul and the early church would have thought they would see Jesus's return in their lifetime? How do you think they would react if they knew that 2000+ years later, the church is still waiting? Based on what we read in 1 Thessalonians 1:8-10, look at and surmise how this early group of believers was waiting. By Paul's encouraging letter, I believe they waited obediently, intentionally, patiently, expectantly, and with a hope and confidence that only faith can provide.

What are we doing while we wait? Could we expect a similar letter of encouragement to be written to us? Are we "on track" as Christ's Church today? Well, I don't expect to receive a letter from Paul, but I know that one day we will be required to give an account of our time and our fruit (Revelation 20:12), both personally and as part of Christ's church. One day when

we face Jesus, we will want to hear "well done" (Matthew 25:23). So as we wait for Jesus's return, we have work to do here on earth. So let's not simply just wait, let's wait with purpose.

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WE	EDNESDAY 3.2.22 –	- ACTS 2:	1-13	

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Have you ever found yourself waiting in great anticipation, eager and ready to receive promised gift or present only to be disappointed or overwhelmed. Acts 2 is a reminder that with God, the promise is always worth the wait... ALWAYS. Jesus said, "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes" (Acts 1:8) and now we see that power on display as the gift is finally received. And it didn't disappoint and it didn't underwhelm, it exceeded EVERY EXPECTATION! God's power displayed! His promise fulfilled!

But notice, this gift, this promise, this waiting, it wasn't about a mere present... it was about presence, His presence, His ultimate promise fulfilled (see Matt 28)! God assures His people again and again throughout scripture that they will never ever be alone. Life will have its frustrations, there will be times of waiting, and you will experience unmet expectations, but His presence NEVER DISAPPOINTS!

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THURSDAY 3.3.22 - ZECHARIAH 4:6

The Prophet Zechariah (whose name means "The Lord Remembers") ministered to the people of Judah after the captives returned to Jerusalem from the Babylonian Exile. He, along with Haggai, encouraged and motivated the people to

complete the rebuilding of the Lord's temple. The people were to do so under the leadership of Zerubbabel, the governor. However, the project was not to be accomplished through human strength alone. The returnees were to appropriate divine resources—the Spirit's enablement. "'Not by might nor by power, but by my Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty."

Likewise, depend upon the help of the Holy Spirit to grow in Christlikeness and to live a life pleasing to the Lord. "For if you live according to the sinful nature, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live" (Romans 8:13).

FRIDAY 3.4.22 - PSALM 51:1-12

In the story of Pinocchio, we find a Cricket named Jiminy who is appointed to be Pinocchio's conscience. Unfortunately, Pinocchio chooses not to listen to Jiminy resulting in his continually finding himself in difficult predicaments. Jiminy's song is "let your conscious be your guide". When we accept Christ as our Savior, the Holy Spirit comes into our lives. In a way He becomes our holy conscious. Unfortunately, like Pinocchio, we often do not listen to the Spirit's leading and we find ourselves in difficult predicaments. May our prayer be "Lord help me to be sensitive to the leading of Your Spirit in my life" as I seek to share the love of Christ with my friends and neighbors.


