False charges are brought against Stephen. When asked to answer these allegations, Stephen gives a speech covering fifty-three verses and two thousand years of Jewish history. Stephen courageously confronts the sin of his fellow Israelites, especially the religious leaders who had put the Messiah to death and were attempting to halt the spread of the gospel. Stephen tells them that they were continually resisting the Holy Spirit and disobeying God's commands. As a result of Stephen's truth telling, the religious leaders angrily put him to death. However, Stephen faces death with courage and a forgiving heart. He asks the Lord not to hold the sin of the religious leaders against them.

THURSDAY 5.12.22 - JOSHUA 1:8-9

"I PICK QUITTING!" The words from my son cut me to the core. He had gone through a rough couple of weeks, and he had enough. "EVERY TIME I GET MY HOPES UP, MY WHOLE WORLD COMES CRASHING DOWN!!!" What is a parent to do?!?

An article from *yellowballoons.net* helped. Among other things, it said, "Throughout life, we will face seasons of disappointment. Times when things do not go according to our plans. When events just don't make sense. When we are hurt, confused, or angry. Courage is perseverance in the face of disappointment. Courage is rooted in faith - faith that pursuing the path Jesus lays out for us has rewards that go beyond mere circumstance. Courage is not the absence of

pain. Boldness does not eliminate our fears; it overcomes them. We can't show courage if all is going as we hope and expect. It is only during disappointment or danger of loss where we have the opportunity to be courageous. Courage is naturally accompanied by fear. And being disappointed does not mean we failed. In fact, we succeed when we face down disappointment and continue striving."
