I really love saying that Jesus came for the broken, the messy, the sinner, the perpetually dependent and needy... the weary. I really love singing about that truth, too. But I really, really, REALLY have a hard time being one of those people. I know intellectually that I need Jesus, but the experience of that is rarely in a heart-warming, soul-cleansing, emotionally-gratifying way. Instead, it usually fleshes itself out in rebuke and/or conviction, a grieved heart, confession, repentance, and a lower view of myself and a higher view of Christ.

We see over and over in Scripture that God responds to us in our weakness and weariness. Psalm 147, Isaiah 55, Matthew 11 quickly come to mind, but if we devoted five minutes to mining the treasure of the Word for more, we'd soon be wading through a steady, growing river of evidence of this truth. That's why it's so important for us to preach the gospel to our own hearts and others as often as we can. We NEED to hear again and again, the invitation that Jesus offers each of us and all of us to come to Himself.

WEDNESDAY 8.24.22 – MATTHEW 28:18-20 In 1851, Queen Victoria and the city of London played host to "The Great Exhibition of the Works of Industry of All Nations." It was an opportunity for inventors to show the most innovative industrial equipment of the day. The machine that won first prize was a masterpiece of 7,000 moving parts. There were gears, pulleys, pistons, bells, and whistles—all perfectly synchronized. However, the machine made nothing—absolutely nothing! Those thousands of parts just pumped, twisted, and turned together. All that power and all that work served no useful purpose. The same thing can happen to a church. It can have a multitude of programs and activities and yet accomplish nothing of eternal value. A church must focus on fulfilling the Great Commission entrusted to them by Jesus: Go, make disciples, baptize them, and teach them to obey all that I have commanded.

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here I am Lord, send me.'"

When I say "Smoky Mountain" I would bet that most of you envision rolling hills with the sun peaking over the mountain top and the fog lifting from the valleys. If you say Smoky Mountain in the Philippines people envision the city dump

that continually smokes because of fires burning beneath the surface and where literally tens of thousands of people live in cardboard shanties and scratch out a horrendous existence scrounging through the garbage. This is just one example of hundreds of thousands of people around the world who desperately need to know that despite where they are Christ loves them and cares about them. As you reflect on this fact this morning, I would ask that you also reflect on the words of the prophet Isaiah, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us? And I said, "Here I am Lord, send me".

CDA OF FOR REFLECTION

THEY HAD NO CITY. Here are people who are lost (verse 4), hungry (verse 5), exhausted (verse 5), and isolated because they did not live in a city (verses 5 and 7). At one level this shows that cities can be good places for human thriving. At the deepest level it means we need Jesus—to heal our spiritual lostness, remove our spiritual hunger, give rest for our spiritual exhaustion, and through his Body end our loneliness.112 So believers work to make our cities good places for everyone to live (Jeremiah 29:7) and also call all to become citizens of the heavenly city (Revelation 21-22; Hebrews 12:22-24) through faith in God.

Prayer: Lord, save me from being so caught up in my own pursuits that I'm not a great neighbor to others in my city. But also save me from being seduced too much by the glitz and excitement of my earthly city. Let my heart rest in its citizenship of your heavenly one. Amen.
