#### MONDAY 10.31.22 — John 13:35

<sup>35</sup> By this everyone will know that you are my disciples if you love one another."

In the Greek language there are multiple words for our English word "love." The highest form of love in the Greek language is agape love which is defined as selfless love. Agape love is love that is not seeking any reward or influence. It is pure unadulterated love. As followers of Christ, agape love comes from the indwelling of the Holy Spirit and a desire to please God. Christ says that agape love, both between believers and to the world at large, is the best way to show the world that we are His followers. Find someone you have no reason to love and love them anyway, not just in your heart but in your actions. If you do this today, I have a word of warning for you, be ready to share the hope you have within you because someone is likely to notice.

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#### **TUESDAY 11.1.22 — 1 Corinthians 1:10**

It doesn't take long to look around and realize that we live in a divided world. We disagree on social issues, political views, and even where to shop or where to eat. Some disagreements even come from within the church itself. Paul shows us that this lack of unity has existed since the first days of the church. He called on believers to find unity with one another in the work that Jesus had done for each of them. Today, if we could fully grasp the love that Jesus has for us ALL, and that He died for EACH ONE OF US, perhaps then we could begin to see others as our brothers and sisters in Christ instead of obstacles to our own personal preferences. Only then can we start to see our differences in a new way. When we see each other through God's eyes, we see how foolish our problems with one another are and we can work together toward unity in our church, and our community. How can you handle your own conflicts and

issues knowing that those you disagree with are also children of God? How you answer this question can be the change!

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#### WEDNESDAY 11.2.22 — Jeremiah 11-12

The Prophet Jeremiah was sent by God to the Southern Kingdom of Judah to pronounce God's judgment upon them for breaking the covenant they had made with Him at Mount Sinai (Exodus 19). We know that it is possible for believers to sin, disobeying God's commands. Considering this fact, what should you do as a child of God? Make three requests to the Lord. First, ask God to check you, examining your life. "Search me, O God ..." (Psalm 139:23-24). Ask Him to reveal any sin you've committed against Him. When He does, secondly, ask God to cleanse you, acknowledging your sin to Him. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins ..." (1 John 1:9). Finally, ask God to change you. "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me" (Psalm 51:10).

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## THURSDAY 11.3.22 — Jonah 2:7

We may never find ourselves swallowed whole, living out our days within the belly of a great fish. But this life will engulf us and leave us feeling helpless at times. That said, prayer is one way we can feel empowered in any given situation. God is present and offers us an ear to listen and a shoulder to lean on. We need only to ask, and the Lord is with us.

From Psalm 8, a short prayer: Oh Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. When I look at all you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? Yet you have given him dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under his feet (including the fish of the sea). We give thanks to you, in all things, with our whole heart. AMEN


