

TUESDAY 11.22.22 — James 4:6

⁶But he gives us more grace. That is what Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble." Have you ever been wrongly accused by someone? That kind of hurt goes deep and we want to retaliate. We want to hurt them in return. We want to tell the world that they were wrong. We find ourselves thinking wrong thoughts and looking for opportunities to get even, and in doing so we grieve the Spirit of God who genuinely desires for us to live a life filled by the Spirit. Further, we rob ourselves of being looked favorably upon by God. In saying this I am not saying that we stuff or ignore our feelings, for that is never a good thing, but rather that we give our feeling to God and allow Him to replace them with His peace. Have you been hurt? Are you fighting the desire to latch out? Take your wrong desires and leave them at the feet of Christ and He will replace them with His peace.

WEDNESDAY 11.23.22 — ACTS 19:8-20

Spiritual darkness permeated ancient Ephesus. When Paul arrived there on his third missionary journey, he encountered demon possession, occult practices, and idol worship. However, through the power of the gospel, Paul was able to triumph over the spiritual darkness of the city. We should not be ashamed of the good news of Jesus because "it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16).

O God, may we not be intimidated by the darkness all around us. May we not believe the enemy's lies about how invisible he is, but may we rather trust in you, the all-powerful God. Help us to walk in your strength, not in our weakness. Make us bold with truth, aggressive in our walk, generous with your light. May darkness retreat around us as we proclaim and live the gospel of your Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

THURSDAY 11.24.22 — Isaiah 61:1

Do you feel free? Free to make the choices you want? Free to do as you please? Do you choose to go to work... choose to attend church... choose to exercise? Do you choose what you eat... what you wear... what you say? We live in a land of freedom. We have more freedom than many others. What do we choose to do with this freedom? God has anointed you to bring good news to others. God has commanded you to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything He has commanded you". 
SPACE FOR REFLECTION

FRIDAY 11.25.22 — Psalm 119:45

THE WORD AND FREEDOM. The more the psalmist seeks to obey God, the more he "walk[s] about in freedom" (verse 45). If God is not ruling us, something else is: sin and habit (verse 133), need for love and approval (verse 42), anxiety, or desire for money and success (verse 36). But when God is in charge, these things lose their inordinate power over us. Not even kings are feared (verse 46). Also, with God comes the freedom of "the mind-stretching encounter with a greater wisdom and vision than one's own. Verse 45 literally means 'at large.'... Moffatt's paraphrase of the verse is ... 'thou dost open up my life.'" Being near creative people frees you to think new thoughts. How much more an encounter with the living God and his Word?

PRAYER: Lord, you do indeed "open up my life." I used to think climbing the ladder of this world was all there was, but now I realize there are untold spiritual realities and eternity and glory to look forward to. I praise you for the astonishing vision of life you give me through your Word. Amen.
