<sup>8</sup> We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; <sup>9</sup> persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. <sup>10</sup> We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. <sup>11</sup> For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that his life may also be revealed in our mortal body.

Although his temies could not prove their accusations, Paul did not go free. It is remained inprisoned in Caesarea for two years. ## FRIDAY 2.17.23 - Psalm 119:1-2


