## MONDAY 2.20.23 - Matthew 5:33-37

J. Vernon McGee writes, "When a man says to me, 'I'd swear on a stack of Bibles a mile high', that is the fellow I do not believe because I think the lie he's telling is a mile high". I swear on the Bible... to God... on my life... on my mother's grave. All common expressions when we are trying to prove to someone we are trustworthy or telling the truth. If we are always honest, giving others no reason to question our integrity, then why do we feel the need to provide proof to anyone? Our scripture today tells us if we live our life the way God commands us, then our word is our oath. No 'I swear by/on' necessary. If we feel the need to swear by something to prove our trustworthiness... then there is evil afoot. Some would say the truth hurts. The Bible tells us the truth will set us free (John 8:32)!

## TUESDAY 2.21.23 - Hebrews 11:1

This word "conviction" carries weight. It implies firmly held beliefs about things. In the law, conviction means the jury believed the evidence against a defendant. Interestingly, the KJV uses a different word than 'conviction' in this verse; it uses the word 'evidence'. Evidence is some proof of the existence of something, and sufficient evidence in court satisfies a jury to convict. What we have by the presence of the Holy Spirit living in us, is faith to believe and trust our One and True God about anything. This faith is proof, evidence, conviction to us of the existence of all God's promises. And we do not conjure this faith up by ourselves, it is a gift of God. Ephesians 2:8-9 explains that Faith is a gift from God given to us so that our eyes may be opened, and we may seek God and find Him. Abraham believed God and it was counted to him as righteousness. His belief was his evidence, his conviction. And praise God, so is ours.

## WEDNESDAY - 2.22.23 - Acts 25:1-12

"That's not fair!" Have you ever made that exclamation as a child? We call attention to injustice because we want wrongs to be made right. However, life many times—but not always—is unfair. Such was the experience of the Apostle Paul. Falsely accused by the Jews, Paul was transferred from Jerusalem to Caesarea to stand trial. Phase one of Paul's trial was before Felix, the Roman governor. Felix was replaced by Porcius Festus. So, phase two of Paul's trial was before Festus. Ultimately, Paul appealed to Caesar, and he would be taken to Rome to stand before Emperor Nero.

When you are wrongly accused and slandered, remember that God-the Judge of Heaven-will hold men accountable. Keep on loving those who mistreat you, as Jesus commanded (Matt.5:43). Rather than becoming bitter and giving up hope, entrust yourself to God, as Jesus did (1 Peter 2:23).

## THURSDAY 2.23.23 – Proverbs 25:21-25

Where, today, can we find such a demonstration of love! Our age is filled with vengeance and retribution for even the slightest of perceived offenses! We are faced daily with stories of those who feel they must meet or, more often, exceed the offense done to them in punishing the offender.

Into this atmosphere, God's Word injects a *radical* response to our enemies! Kindness! In the use of the words "bread" and "water", this admonition addresses **all** of our enemies needs for life.

Isn't this a bit overboard? Christian, consider what your Savior has done for YOU! While we were sinners, enemies of God, Christ died for us! When you heard of the love of Jesus, what God did for YOU, did that not "heaps coals upon your head" to bring you to repentance? Has He not rewarded you?

Has anyone ever said something about you that was untrue and hurtful? What did you do with the pain it caused? In our Scripture for today we see that David was experiencing this kind of pain, and as we read David's response to his pain, we can gain insight into how we should handle similar situations.

- 1. Rather than keeping his pain to himself David admitted his pain to God and talked openly and honestly with God about his pain.
- 2. He asked God to help him deal with the pain and to be brought back into God's presence.
- 3. He realized that in God he would find joy and delight.
- 4. He put his hope in God and offered up praise.

Struggling with feelings of being hurt by someone. Rather than letting the pain come between you and God, try the four steps mentioned above. It worked for David.


