Our scripture mentions the missing word above four times in two versus. Do you think maybe this word is important? Note that the song does not say that they will know we are Christians by our buildings or meals or programs or any kind of works that we do. We are commanded to love one another. "We are one in the Spirit; we are one in the Lord. We will work with each other; we will work side by side. We will guard each man's dignity and save each man's pride." Let us join together, in love, to serve those around us. Together, out of the shared love we have for our Heavenly Father, "we pray that our unity will one day be restored."

### **TUESDAY 3.28.23 – Colossians 4:2**

<sup>2</sup>Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful.

As you reflect on today's devotional, I want to encourage you to read today's Scripture in the context of the verses that follow, verses 3-6, and ask yourself what Paul is asking of us. Allow me to make a few observations:

- Vs. 2, Prayer should be your go to, not your last resort.
- Vs. 2, Be on the alert looking for things that call for prayer.
- Vs 2, Believe that God will answer your prayer and thank Him for answering prayer even in advance.
- Vs. 3-4, Pray for the church staff that they will be good and faithful ministers of the Gospel and that God would provide them with opportunities to do so.
- Vs. 5-6, Pray for yourselves that you may be good ambassadors for Christ throughout each day and in every situation, so that you may leave the sweet aroma of Christ lingering everywhere you go.

WEDNESDAY - 3.29.23 - John 20:21
"As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." Jesus was commissioned by God, the Father. The Lord sent Jesus into the world as His representative to reveal His words and works. As His representative, Jesus did what the Father would have done and said what the Father would have said (John 5:19). Jesus revealed the Father's character through the signs that He performed and the mission of redemption that He carried out (1 John 4:14). Now, Jesus passes this commission on to us, His followers. We are His representatives in the world. We speak His message through the proclamation of the gospel (John 3:14-16), and we demonstrate that we belong to Him through the acts of love that we perform to fellow believers (John 13:35).
As Holy Week and Resurrection Sunday approaches, ask God for special opportunities to share the good news of Christ with others.

### THURSDAY 3.30.23 – Isaiah 45:22

"I am the Lord, there is no other." Isaiah 45 details the Lord's assertions of omnipotence and total Lordship. Ultimately all will bow before Him (v. 23); yet in verse 22, the Lord makes an incredible invitation to all the world, "Turn to me and be saved all you ends of the earth." That invitation still stands. John 3:16 tells us God so loved the world that He provided the means for everyone's salvation – belief in His son Jesus, who sacrificed Himself for our sins.

In Matthew 28:18-19, the resurrected Jesus established His Divine Kingship and reissued this invitation to the world by challenging His disciples and us today,

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations...." How can we not obey the Lord of the universe? This is our Great Commission.

This is a special Psalm that helps us understand the basics of evangelism and missions. The import of the opening verses

This is a special Psalm that helps us understand the basics of evangelism and missions. The import of the opening verses presses home the need to share information with other people. They can be anyone, but clearly our experience claims that family will be the hardest for us. What do we share? His deeds are what we share. What has He done for me? That is what I may share. I do not need to study the encyclopedia or purchase any commentaries. I just tell others what God has done for me and how he continues to work in my own life. Those examples would be His deeds made known among the people.

Lastly, is what He does in my life considered Wonderful? How can miracles, faithfulness, provision, and abundant living be anything other than wonderful? Thus, when I share my life, it is sharing the wonderous deeds He has done.

What a joy it is to be His missionary!
