¹⁵ He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation.

Why do people tend to shy away from sharing the gospel. People say:

- I let my life be my witness.
- I do not have the gift of evangelism.
- I just don't know what to say.
- I am afraid of what people will think.

Today's scripture clearly called us to preach the gospel. I would like to offer a simple suggestion that I think might help us overcome these excuses. Here it is, "Let our goal be to share the gospel with everyone". If someone tells you that you seem different than most other people, be ready to tell them why that is. More important than having the gift of evangelism is to ask, "what are my gifts, and am I using them to build relationships that will allow me to share Christ"? Don't worry about not knowing what to say, ask God to give you the words. Ask God to replace your fears with His courage.

Falling on Maundy Thursday, this devotional brings to mind so many meaningful words and phrases. Passover, Lord's Supper, Last Supper, bread and cup, body and blood, covenant, maundy (Latin root for command). Any time we are fortunate enough to take part in Holy Communion, we should gather at the table and search our hearts. What we do at the table is in remembrance of

Jesus Christ. Shouldn't our actions, words, and thoughts away from the table be the same? Do we remember His final command while taking the bread and cup He so willingly gave?

We need to give thanks as we look back at what He did upon being crucified and we need to be filled with confident expectation as we look ahead to His return. "For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26).

But, for those found in Christ, "the Lord has laid on him the iniquities of us ALL." On the cross, MY burdens gladly bearing, He bled and died to take away MY sin.

Ponder that if you will. MY \sin - YOUR \sin . He bore on that cross. ALL of it.


