MONDAY 5.8.23 - Matthew 7:15-20

Nobody likes rotten fruit. But sometimes we are deceived by its appearance: it looks good on the outside, but is decaying from the core. Matthew 7 warns us about the rotten spiritual fruit that is produced by false teachers. False teachers offer appealing messages that we like to hear, but their substance leads us to spiritual destruction. Just as we are warned about new scams and given ways to identify fraudulent business offers, the Bible warns us about spiritual scammers (false teachers) and provides the way to identify them: by their fruit. Galatians 5:19-21 clearly lists the fruits of the flesh, which include acts of sexual immorality, idolatry, jealousy, divisiveness, and drunkenness. We need to examine the message and the lives of would-be instructors against the standards of Biblical truth. That way we will not become the victims of those who would gain from leading us astray spiritually.

TUESDAY 5.9.23 - 2 Timothy 4:3-5

These are interesting verses. They call to us to bear the truth to all we meet. In past days, these verses may have implored us to be bearers of God's good news but if we failed, well our neighbor may hear it from someone else. But in today's economy, as is true in farther reaches of the world, we may be the only source of truth our neighbor has. Especially as telling the truth becomes increasingly difficult in this woke world. In such an instance, the urgency of this charge to Timothy becomes our urgency, too. Read these verses again, this time imagining that only you hold the truth of God's good news and a neighbor or storekeeper, government official, contractor, friend, or family member has inquired about it from you. Perhaps they have not inquired but exhibit a need that only God answers, and you hold the key.

There might even be a consequence if we speak. These verses end with this advice, "Fulfill your ministry." God bless us, every one.

WEDNESDAY - 5.10.23 - Galatians 1:11-24

Following his salvation experience on the Damascus Road, the Apostle Paul attended ABC (Arabia Bible College), and had Jesus as his sole instructor. So, Paul received his message directly from the Lord Himself. No man–apostle or otherwise–taught Paul the gospel. Paul went on to impact people's lives powerfully with the good news of Jesus, and he demonstrated to believers how to live the Christian life. Many Christians were influenced by Paul's example.

After serving the Lord for over fifteen years in Pakistan, missionary Warren Webster was invited to speak at the Urbana Missionary Conference. In his message, he stated: "If I had my life to live over again, I would live it to change the lives of people, because you have not changed anything until you've changed the lives of people."

Ask God to use you to influence others to trust Christ and to follow Him.
