### MONDAY 6.12.23 - Luke 17:3-4

All dissonant chords like to be resolved into peaceful major chords. Broken fellowship among believers is like dissonant chords and the music it makes is harsh and unruly. Broken fellowship should seek restoration through a process often called 'peace making.' Jesus taught that we should forgive each other when we wrong a friend, or more specifically when a friend wrongs us. How easy it is to harbor a secret anger which later blossoms into bitterness. Better it is to forgive. Simple things should be merely overlooked, but greater things need to be hashed out with kindness, compassion and mercy. Repentance and forgiveness go together like a hand and glove. The alternative is too much to deal with. Consider the introductory verses 1 and 2. To not forgive, thus causing another to stumble, Jesus admonishes, 'better to be thrown into the sea...'

So let us remember to always be slow to anger and quick to forgive.

## TUESDAY 6.13.23 - Ephesians 4:31-32

<sup>31</sup> Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. <sup>32</sup> Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

I have a brother in Christ that I have offended. I am not sure what I did to hurt him. I have apologized even though I am unaware of what I have done. I have asked for forgiveness, but until now he has refused to do so. This saddens me, not for me, but for him. Every time he sees me his countenance drops. The sight of me completely shrouds his ability to see Christ. That is what bitterness does. Usually, it is not the person at which the bitterness is aimed who suffers, but rather the person harboring the bitterness. Worse yet, if that person is a Christian, it clouds their ability to see and worship Christ.

As you read this today, are you harboring bitterness toward someone? If so, I beseech you, do whatever it takes to let it go.

In doing so it will be good to have the human relationships restored and even better to have your spiritual relationship with Christ restored.

The Apostle Paul is astonished that the Galatian believers have

abandoned the truth of the gospel of Jesus and have embraced

the Old Testament Law of Moses as a means of securing eternal

salvation. Paul makes it abundantly clear that justification (being

declared right in God's eyes) is a free gift (apart from works) and is received by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone (2:16, 21). This was the initial belief of the Galatian Christians

(1:6), and in the early verses of chapter 3, Paul reminds his

readers of their personal experience when he preached the

gospel to them on his first missionary journey. Paul begins

Attend church? Sing worshipfully? Hear the sermon? Attend a small group? Read the Bible? Pray? Do you believe...? Do you truly believe that your life is changed because of your faith? In other words, in response to Abram's faith, the Lord declared that Abram was now righteous and justified in His sight. True faith in the Lord has consequences. Abram believed. What if he didn't. How does his story change? How does YOUR story change?

### FRIDAY - 6.16.23 - Psalm 32:1-2

Legend has it that Ponce de Leon explored near St. Augustine, FL in the 1500's, looking for the Fountain of Youth. If you drank from its waters, you would never grow old.

If you ever found such a place, could you keep it a secret? Wouldn't you want to tell family, friends, those around if not the whole world?

These two verses speak of a Fountain even more wonderful than the Fountain of Youth. They are a reflection of the blessedness that comes to one whose sins are forgiven. Admitting our sin before God can be difficult. It means acknowledging our failure and then repenting of what we have done, which can be even harder. But as the burden of guilt is lifted, and our transgressions are covered by the blood of Jesus, we experience a new life and one that will last forever in the presence of our Savior.

How can we not share the joy of what we've discovered?

# Galatians 2:11-21 *Watch Your Step*

"For though a righteous man falls seven times, he rises again." ~ Proverbs 24:16

1. A\_\_\_\_\_ that you can \_\_\_\_\_ (vv 11-12)

When Peter stopped eating with Gentile believers, he was giving approval to the false idea that a Gentile needed to become a Jew in order to be a Christian.

2. A\_\_\_\_\_\_ that your fall can \_\_\_\_\_\_ affect others (v 13)

Peter stopped eating with Gentile Christians in Antioch and others Jewish believers followed his example.

3. A\_\_\_\_\_ correction from \_\_\_\_\_ when you fall (vv 14-21)


Paul uses the verb "*justified*" four times in verses 16 and 17. He uses the noun form one time in verse 21, translated by the word "*righteousness*." Paul uses the word "*faith*" four times in this passage. It occurs three times in verse 16 and once in verse 20.

The moment you place your faith in Jesus to forgive your sin, God declares you justified-not guilty in His eyes (v 16).

When someone confronts you:

- L\_\_\_\_\_(Proverbs 13:1)
- C\_\_\_\_\_(1 Peter 2:2)
- A\_\_\_\_\_(2 Peter 3:15)
