TUESDAY 7.4.23 - 2 Peter 3:9

⁹ The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead, he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

WEDNESDAY – 7.5.23 – Galatians 3:23-29

"You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus."

It was the responsibility of a Greek or Roman guardian to keep watch over minor children until they reached legal adulthood. After that, the son no longer needed supervision. The Old Testament Law acted as a guardian for the nation of Israel. The Law kept the Jews "in line," so to speak, until the arrival of the Messiah when the full revelation of the gospel was given to the world. When any person—whether Jew or Gentile—places their faith in Jesus for eternal life, they become a child of God and belong to His family. The ground is level at the foot of the cross. No one is any better than anyone else. We are all equally brothers and sisters in the Lord and fellow members of God's family through trust in Christ.

THURSDAY 7.6.23 – Deuteronomy 7:6

"For you are a people holy to the Lord your God. The Lord your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on the face of the earth to be his people, his treasured possession."

The versus prior to this one include specific instructions on how God's people were to act toward those who opposed their faith...

God chose you! Your faith is not meant to be passive! Armor up!!!


