### WEDNESDAY - 7.19.23 - Galatians 4:12-20

"I plead with you, brothers ...." This is the appeal of a concerned spiritual father for the welfare of his spiritual children. Paul founded the churches of Galatia on his first missionary journey (Acts 13-14). He led these believers to Christ, sharing with them the pure gospel of Jesus. Additionally, Paul helped them to grow in their walk with the Lord, demonstrating Christlikeness. He reminds the Galatians that it was through some physical affliction that he first came to them, and that they treated him like an angel. Now, unfortunately, they were treating him like an enemy because he was telling them the truth. Paul encourages these Galatian Christians to turn from the false teaching that they have embraced and to become like he is—true and loyal to Jesus Christ. May the Lord help us not to stray from the truth, but to be faithful followers of the Savior.

Even as believers age, becoming physically frail, they remain full of spiritual sap, tapping into that Holy Spirit on behalf of themselves and others. # Galatians 4:1-11 Know Your Rights

Paul begins by discussing your past, present, and future.

1. In the Past-\_\_\_\_\_(vv 1-3)

In the ancient world, a child was no different from a slave. A slave didn't have freedom, and he couldn't do whatever he wanted. The same was true of a child.

We put restrictions on children for their own safety. That's what God did for His people by giving them the Old Testament Law. Now that Christ has come, things are different.

2. In the Present—\_\_\_\_\_(vv 4-5)

The word "adoption" or "full rights as sons" as used in the Bible describes a father declaring that his natural-born son is now officially a mature adult with all the rights and privileges of the household.

When the right time came, God sent Jesus to redeem you as an adult son. God set you free from the Old Testament Law which was your guardian and manager. Now, God has granted you full rights as His adult son.


3. In the Future—\_\_\_\_\_(vv 6-11)

You possess part of your inheritance right now—the Holy Spirit lives within you. The moment you trusted in Jesus for eternal life, the Holy Spirit entered your physical body, and it's a permanent indwelling. However, there are more benefits God has in store for you in the future.

• A better \_\_\_\_\_ (cf. Romans 8:23)

• A better \_\_\_\_\_ (cf. Revelation 21, 22)

Just think of what God has in store for you as His heir! So, why would you want to go back to the A-B-C's of your childhood (vv 8-11)?
