MONDAY 7.24.23 - John 15:5

John 14 closes with Jesus telling His disciples, "Come now; let us leave." This suggests that the next two chapters might have been spoken on the way to the Garden of Gethsemane. It is possible that they were passing some vineyards when Jesus gave the analogy of the vine and branches in the beginning of chapter 15. The analogy teaches one main truth—the importance of a believer remaining in fellowship with Jesus in order to be a fruitful Christian. To remain in Christ does not mean to keep yourself saved. A believer is eternal secure in Jesus Christ (John 10:27-29). Rather, it means to live in His Word and pray (v 7), obey His commandments (v 10), and keep our lives clean through His Word (vv 3-4). A believer who remains in fellowship with Jesus moves from producing "fruit" to "more fruit" (v 2) to "much fruit" (v 8).

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TUESDAY 7.25.23 - Colossians 1:9-10

⁹ For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, ^[a] ¹⁰ so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God,

The focus of today's Scripture is as much on prayer as it is on spiritual growth. I think that is because the two-go hand in hand. I do not think that a person will grow spiritually if they are not in touch with God and seeking His will, and this will only come from an attitude of prayer. The flip side of this train of thought is that spiritual growth is inevitable if we have a genuine attitude of prayer. Further, if we truly want to grow in our faith, we will get others involved in the process as we fellowship with our brothers and sisters in Christ and enlist their prayers for us as we seek God's will for our lives. Do you want to grow in your faith? I would recommend two things.

First, be purposeful in spending time in God's Word and in prayer each day.

Second, fellowship with fellow believers regularly, and ask them to be praying for you as you seek God's will for your life.

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WEDNESDAY - 7.26.23 - Nehemiah 4:20

Sometimes you struggle. Sometimes you have trouble completing a task. How do you respond when this happens? Do you **choose** to listen to the external voices insulting and criticizing you? Do you **choose** to listen to the voices of doubt and confusion you hear from within? Or do you **choose** to be the voice of encouragement and strength pushing yourself forward? That's right... **CHOOSE**!!! You will encounter opposition in your life. The way you respond in these situations defines who you are. Will you be like Sanballat... mocking, insulting, and combative? Will you be like Judah... doubtful and disheartened? Will you choose to be like Nehemiah... empowering, supportive, and encouraging? You have a voice! Use it to be a positive influence in your own life and the lives of those around you! Sound the trumpet... rally... fight!!!

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THURSDAY 7.27.23 - Lamentations 3:55-59

Everyone reading this devotional has known heartache. Heart break is a common ailment of the human soul. If family members or loved ones did not let us down or if others did not oppose us unreasonably, then we would fail on our own accord. It is just so much the nature of the brokenness of our world.

But out of the depths of our malignancies we cry to our God because we have no other place to turn, knowing in our hearts that he hears us, but not seeing him with our eyes. Our own experiences tell us that he is the faithful one, always ready to answer us and bear our sorrows. More than that, the verses scheduled today say he actually fights for us, he fights our battles for us and takes up our cause. It just cannot get better than that. Thank you, Lord.

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FRIDAY-7.28.23 - Psalm 55:16-18

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The humanity of David and the other psalmists is revealed in their songs of joy, hope, despair, praise, and prayers. We find their thoughts and concerns relatable to our own lives, no matter how different the situations. Psalm 55 reveals a speaker (presumably David) in crisis, in great fear. Like him, how often we sink into anguish over our circumstances whether they be financial, relational, emotional, or physical. Like him also, we can follow his 3 steps to deliverance. First he calls out to God, whom he loves and worships. Second he makes it clear that the Lord is listening 24/7. Finally, he declares that the Lord has rescued him, even though opposed by many. David put his trust in the Lord in his darkest hours, so should we give Him our every care and all our needs. He will not fail us. Praise the Lord!
