MONDAY 2.26.24 - 1 John 1:7-9

⁷ But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all^[a] sin. ⁸ If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ⁹ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰ If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

When we think about sin, we tend to think about the big sins. Things like adultery, murder, eval thoughts, outburst of anger and the like. The word sin means to miss the mark, not hitting a bullseye if you will.

1 Peter 1:15 says, But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; ... That is a small bullseye to try and hit! I just gossiped, oops! I am a little to the right. I just had an unkind thought; oops! I am a little to the left. I know this is extreme. I do not think that God is setting up in heaven counting all our sins. I do believe that in every situation we should be striving to be more like Christ. You might say, "that means I should have Christ on my mind at all times throughout each day". I would say, that is not a bad Idea!

TUESDAY 2.27.24 - 2 Timothy 2:20-21

D. L. Moody didn't want any sin to disrupt his intimacy with God. Because of this, Moody kept short accounts with God, immediately confessing any known sin. Each night, he also allowed the Lord to shine an interrogating spotlight on all the events of the day. Before retiring for the evening, Moody would review his day with the Lord, asking God to reveal anything that displeased Him. D. L. Moody exemplifies the kind of heart preparation needed to be a clean instrument for God's work. When we perform service for the Lord, we must make sure we have a clean heart, confessing any known sin in our lives.

It is also good to prayerfully ask God to examine our actions, thoughts, motives, and words. Because God is perfectly holy, He won't tolerate sin or commune with unrighteousness. Light has no fellowship with darkness (1 John 1:5-7).

(trust) in Christ alone (v 16). Christ moves Nicodemus from the concept of physical birth to the second birth or becoming a child of God. Water is an integral part of the physical birthing process. Jesus simply explains that physical birth was one of water. To enter into God's kingdom, Nicodemus needed a second birth made possible only through the Holy Spirit. As Jesus elaborates to Nicodemus several moments later, if he would believe in Christ, this second birth and entrance into eternal life would be his (v 15). The Old Testament predicts this spiritual transformation (Ezekiel 36:24-27), and as a teacher of Israel (v 10), Nicodemus should have understood Jesus' illustration.

CDACE FOR REELECTION

The first thing that comes to view in these verses is that each of the three verses begins with the pronoun "I". The active person is God Himself. If our ever-present sin, which does so easily and persistently entangle us, is ever to be dismissed, it is because God would do it, not we ourselves. Try as we might, we cannot purify ourselves.

If we think we can desire God or want to please Him or even seek Him, these verses claim God makes that happen in our lives. He provides a desire in us to repent, seek Him and want Him.

Even after our point of salvation, we are unable to grow in the spirit without God's active participation. Just think, your salvation and love of the Lord and His daily Lordship in your life is His working His good pleasure in you. Praise Him.

SPACE FOR REFLECTION

Just like the Israelites in the Old Testament, Christians are a separated people. As part of the Abrahamic Covenant, God initiated the rite of circumcision so that the Jewish people would be set apart. This physical act made them different from all other people groups and marked them as followers of Yahweh. As Christians, we are spiritually circumcised by God when we accept Jesus as our Savior. He sets us apart by circumcising our hearts so that we can fully love and honor Him -- as He commands - with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength (Mark 12:30-31). This is still the first and greatest commandment. Only by fully loving the Lord can we show His love to others - the second greatest commandment - and draw them to Him. The best part: God works in our hearts to make this possible. We do not do this in our own strength.
