Ours is a God worthy of worship and He loves us enough to tell us how to do that. Do it with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength.

FRIDAY 4.5.24.24 - Psalm 99:1-5

More than any other word, the Bible calls God Holy. Pastor Lyon has told us repeatedly that "to be Holy," is to be "set apart." As Spurgeon pondered these five verses, he wrote, "Saints quiver with devout emotion, and sinners quiver with terror when the rule of Jehovah is fully perceived and felt."

Verse 5 sums it all up by directing us to exalt the Lord and worship at his footstool. We are directed to 'kneel in praise' and are told once again that He is HOLY.

3. Jesus keeps the _____ He makes (vv 5-6)


Jesus predicted His resurrection. He told His disciples that He would rise from the dead (Matthew 16:21, 17:22-23, 20:18-19).
