#### MONDAY 5.13.24 - Matthew 3:16-17

<sup>16</sup> As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. <sup>17</sup> And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

Notice the presence of the Holy Trinity as Christ was baptized by John the Baptist. The Holy Spirit descends like a dove upon Christ and the Father speaks from heaven, as the Son comes out of the water and His ministry begins on earth.

But what does all of this have to do with us?

Though Christ was sinless, He submitted to baptism as an act or obedience to fulfill all righteousness. (Matthew 3:15).

We too are called to obey God's commands and follow His will for our lives. By the indwelling of the Holy Spirit we are empowered to live a life that honors God and serves others. Just as Christ's ministry began at His baptism: we are called to love others, share the Gospel and continue His ministry on earth. Finally, as adopted sons and daughters, God delights in us as well.

Isn't it wonderful to bask in the unconditional love and acceptance of our heavenly Father?

# **TUESDAY 5.14.24 - Luke 24:25-27**

<sup>25</sup> He said to them, "How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! <sup>26</sup> Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?" <sup>27</sup> And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

Moses was the earthly author of the first five books of the Old Testament. Essentially what today's scripture is telling us is that

Christ worked His way through the entire Old Testament showing them what the scriptures had foretold about Him.

It is amazing that hundreds of years before His birth the scripture foretold of His life, death, and resurrection. Despite this most of His audience never realized and accepted who He was. As we look back on the life of Jesus, there is more written, both biblically and extra biblically regarding the life, death, and resurrection of Christ then of any other individual in history. Despite all this evidence, people still do not realize and accept who Jesus is and what He has done for them. Have you come to the point of realizing who this man is and what He did for you? Have you accepted Him? Are you living for Him?

THE FORMER LEGITION
WEDNESDAY 5.15.24 - John 6:1-13
"Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" Jesus expected an answer from Philip, but His intent was not to stump or to embarrass him. Rather, Jesus wanted to stretch Philip's faith and to help him to grow stronger spiritually. Philip's test is explained by the words "for He Himself knew what He was intending to do." Like a brilliant chess player that thinks several moves ahead, Jesus plots a strategy to build the faith of His disciples. Likewise, your circumstances are ruled by a King who seeks your highest good. Is that how you view the situations that pressure you or bring you unexpected challenges? God is at work in your life, and His strategy is to stretch your faith so that you will "consider it all joy when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance" (James 1:2-4).
