Instead, Joseph chose to believe what God was telling him and, his faith paved the way for the messiah's birth. How much better we would be if we like Joseph chose to believe God rather than trying to justify why not to believe. Are there areas in your life were God is speaking and asking you to believe in faith what He is telling you? Joseph was not sorry, he believed. If you choose to believe in faith what God is saying to you today, you will not be sorry either.
