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TUESDAY 3.25.25 - Romans 12:17-10

Romans 12:17-19, ¹⁷ Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone. ¹⁸ If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone. ¹⁹ Do not take revenge, my dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written: "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord.

The world says hate, hurt, and avenge. God says love, love, love. You say, how can I do what God wants when all I feel is hurt, hate and a desire for revenge. You need to realize two things. First, love in not a feeling, but a choice you must make. Secondly, God is love and He is alive and active within you. God can love anyone through you, even if you are not feeling the love, so long as you are willing to submit to His will for your life. Do you have people in your life that have hurt you and, as a result, you are finding it very hard to show them love. Why not ask God to love them for you and through you. If you do this, you will find that it is healing for you and perhaps life changing for the person who is the focus of God's love flowing through you.


How to respond to unfair treatment:
