#### MONDAY 3.31.25 - Luke 14:26-27

If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple. And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

Living the Christian life is easy. "April fools!" Being committed to Christ means being willing to give up everything for His sake. Throughout the Old Testament God was willing to tolerate a lot when it came to the behavior of Israel, but the one thing He would not tolerate was their worship of false Gods and Idols. God is a jealous God and wanted Israel to worship Him and Him alone. The same is true for us today. God is saying, I want your worship, praise, trust, loyalty, faith, and service, to be to me and only me. Are there things in your life that you are putting before God? If so, are you willing to give them to God and say to Him, Lord, I will worship you and you alone. Being a disciple of Christ is costly and requires sacrifice, but it is nothing compared to the price He paid and the sacrifice He made for you.

# TUESDAY 4.1.25 - 2 Timothy 2:3-4

Today's verses help us focus on the direction of our mission. Soldiers have been given instructions; they know the mission and the goal and take actions only consistent with accomplishing that goal. Distractions divert from the mission, wreak havoc and cause defeat. In a similar manner, God has given us a mission. That is to obey Him, glorify Him and praise Him. We are a billboard about Him to the watching world. Consistent with our mission, we should be mindful to make life choices to accomplish the mission. Pursuits that take us elsewhere wreak havoc and cause defeat. So, the message, stay faithful and remember the mission. As Peter teaches in, I Peter 2, put off bad behavior and put on good behavior, that the world may see your good works and glorify God.

### WEDNESDAY 4.2.25 - John 19:17-37

In June 2023, Courtney Dauwalter set a woman's record finishing the Western States 100-mile race. The previous record had stood for 11 years. When making the final turn toward the finish line, Dauwalter stated, "That was the moment I let myself actually believe that we had finished."

On the cross, Jesus cries out, "It is finished." Some people could make the mistake of thinking that Jesus was referring to His earthly life, saying His life had ended. However, the term was used in Greek commercial life to signify the discharge of a debt by a completed payment. By His death, Jesus accomplished what we sinful humans could not. He lived a sinless life and offered Himself as a sinless sacrifice in payment for our sins. "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21).

## **THURSDAY 4.3.25 - Genisis 3:15**

This verse speaks out in such odd verbiage that it is easy to read over it and move on to others. It is God speaking and He speaks language that we know is higher than ours. All in all, this verse, packed with wonderful, good news, passes easily by. Mankind has just sinned for the first time, and Satan is being cursed. God asks him no questions nor ponders any answers from him. God's words demonstrate a plan already constructed. Enmity, we get the word enemy from it, is put between Satan and an heir of Eve.

Imagine, God shared Good News with mankind at the first sin. Satan would hate us but one of us would 'bruise his head'. While Satan one day hence, would kill the human body of Jesus, Jesus would win the victory three days later. Righteousness would win over sin and death. Shared with us by God, himself, on that early day so long ago.

# FRIDAY 4.4.25 - Psalm 22:14-18

- <sup>14</sup>I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart has turned to wax; it has melted within me.
- <sup>15</sup> My mouth<sup>[a]</sup> is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth, you lay me in the dust of death.
- 16 Dogs surround me, a pack of villains encircles me; they pierce<sup>[b]</sup> my hands and my feet. <sup>17</sup> All my bones are on display; people stare and gloat over me. <sup>18</sup> They divide my clothes among them and cast lots for my garment.

We read Psalm 22 and know we are reading of Christ's crucifixion. Yet, how could David describe the wounds of crucifixion hundreds of years before the Romans adopted the Persian practice. It seems impossible.

As David wrote of his own suffering, the Holy Spirit inspired him to write prophetically of the Lord's crucifixion, as confirmed by John 19:24.

Can you imagine every square inch of the state of Texas covered in silver dollars to a depth of two feet. Now let's send you wandering the state blindfolded, assigned the impossible task of finding the only dollar marked with a red X. The odds of you finding that dollar, are the same as the chances of just **eight**Biblical prophecies coming true, or one out of 100,000,000,000,000,000

Yet over **three-hundred** Biblical prophecies were fulfilled in the birth, life and death of Christ. That is impossible! But remember: No matter what giant you now face - Nothing is impossible for our God. Turn to Him.

John 19:1-16 The Evil of Expediency

Question: How did Pilate move from acquitting Jesus (John 18:38) to condemning Jesus (John 19:16)?

Answer:

1. THE ROOT (vv 12-13)

Pilate knew the right thing to do. Mark 15:10 informs us that Pilate knew that the chief priests had handed over Jesus because of envy.

Why should Pilate do the right thing? Because it was the right thing to do! However, many people don't think that way anymore. Most people base their actions on how it will benefit them.

Pilate wanted to release Jesus. He knew that Jesus was innocent. but Pilate caved in to the threats of the Jewish leaders.

2. THE ROUTE (vv 1-6)

If Pilate found no fault in Jesus, then why did he order Jesus to be flogged? We call that compromise. When you compromise truth, you produce error. Right and wrong are not on the same plain, and once you do a little wrong, it's easier to do more wrong.

3. THE FRUIT (vv 7-11, 14-16)

When you yield to peer pressure, it produces fear and confusion in your life.

Jesus is standing in Pilate's hall Friendless, forsaken, betrayed by all: Listen to the sudden call! What will you do with Jesus?

What will you do with Jesus? Neutral you cannot be; Someday your heart will be asking, "What will He do with me?"
